Greetings to all Members and a huge welcome to new members, particularly our new junior members.

The committee would like to keep you up to date with what has been going on in this difficult year and how we hope to plan for the future. Luckily one of the sports able to continue has been fishing, but we have had to run the competitions strictly in line with Angling Trust Guidelines, which at times has been difficult, because we all like to compare our catches.

SHORE REPORT

However, the Club has pulled together and with your great support we have managed to run a Shore League, Knockout and Pairs which we hope to be able to complete in December. It has been disjointed having to deal with 2 Lockdowns but we have had 44 different members fish so far this year averaging over 20 per Competition, so we consider that a success bearing in mind the circumstances. A one off memorial trophy in honor of Bob Patterson will be presented for this year's Senior Shore Champion, Senior Shore Runner Up, Junior Shore Champion, Ladies Shore Champion, Knockout winner and cash prizes for the Pairs winners

Congratulations to Will Constance who managed to break the Club shore caught Blonde Ray record which has stood since 1972. Will's Ray was 4kg 139g measuring 53cm across the wings. Well done.

There is no doubt Covid 19 will have implications for the way we fish into next year. For this reason, we must ensure that the relevant guidelines are observed at all times particularly during the sign on and weigh in. We all have varying opinions about this virus but please bear in mind some members are more likely to be impacted than others and we owe it to them to ensure they can fish with peace of mind.

We would ask that you wear a mask just while signing on and at the end while handing in your record card, and observe the relevant social distancing and rules on groups. We also ask that you place the exact entry fee in an envelope with your name(s) and put it in a box provided by the Signing on Officer. At the end of the Competition please place your record card in the box provided. Once these restrictions are lifted, we should be able enjoy a more relaxed and sociable weigh in.

We still hope to hold our final Competition of the year at Weston on Sunday 6th December subject to Covid restrictions lifting. We are not able to conduct the normal raffle as previously explained but the Club will be putting the Xmas Fayre fund into the prize pot allowing us to pay 7 places on the day. As members have contributed to the fund throughout the year, this match will be for <u>members only</u> so please no guests on this occasion.

Regretfully, we shall not be able to hold an Annual General Meeting this year where all members can express their views and vote for or against proposed changes. Therefore, if you have anything you wish to raise then please do so by writing to any Committee member by Sat 5 December 2020.

The following are proposed for next year: -

- 1. Run a full Championship and associated trophies with 13 Competitions counting the best 10 scores. This will include a Knockout and Pairs Competition.
- 2. No fishing allowed 30 minutes prior to the start of a competition.
- 3. Record cards to be signed off by another member confirming measurements have been witnessed and lone anglers must photo every fish against a measure showing whole fish from head to tail
- 4. Increase the Match Fee to £5 inclusive of £1 Heaviest Fish Pool.
- 5. Increase the number of cash prizes for each Competition to 5 places providing we have a minimum of 15 anglers. If we have 25 or more anglers then 6 places will be paid out. There will be a cap of £25 for winner. This will allow more people to have the chance of a cash prize. If less than 5 weigh in then funds to be split proportionally between them with no cap.
- 6. Only £5 to be taken from Match fees towards Xmas Fayre rather than 10% generally meaning a larger prize pot for Competitors.
- 7. Decrease the minimum size limit for Conger Eels to 80cm. At this size they are still a substantial fish converting to just under 1kg and will increase catches.

We have 13 planned fixtures and the signing on points and boundaries will be advertised on Facebook and the Club website prior to each match. The boundaries will also be shown on the Club board at the sign on. If in doubt please ask.
